Due to a significant lead gift directed to the building of an Arts Center (which includes a Student Life Center), we are in a unique position to test for support for the additional funds required for the Arts Center and for interest and support for other master plan projects and initiatives that are part of Phase III of the Master Plan.

THE VISION

The planned 400+ seat Arts and Student Life Center ("Arts Center") is more than meets the eye. It will be, first and foremost, a state-of-the art high school theater, concert hall, and art gallery. The retractable seat design will allow for multiple uses for the space, including lectures, student meetings, new extracurricular activities, retreats, ceremonies, alumni events, other larger group gatherings, enhanced instructional opportunities, and summer camps for future Trojans, to name a few. The Arts Center will also serve the wider North Deanery community as a venue for parish school musicals and theatrical performances, which helps support our parish communities and the long-term enrollment vitality of Bishop Chatard High School.

FEASIBILITY STUDY

A Feasibility Study was initiated by BCHS in January 2023 with the formation of a Steering Committee composed of school leaders, with representation from administration, staff, alumni, parents, alumni parents, and friends. This Steering Committee has been tasked with the responsibility of determining if the implementation and completion of Phase III of the Master Plan has sufficient support to be successfully undertaken. The work of the Committee consists of taking the necessary steps in this Feasibility Study process.

Helping to select leaders to be interviewed and surveyed

Conducting approximately 60 confidential, one-on-one interviews with Bishop Chatard High School leaders

Presenting the results of this Feasibility Study to school leaders



QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

WHY IS THE ARTS CENTER PRIORITIZED OVER OTHER PROJECTS?

We have been blessed with a lead gift of \$5 million directed to the Arts Center. As a result, our first priority for Phase III of our Master Plan will be to raise the balance required to complete this project.

WHAT IS THE COST OF THE ARTS CENTER?

Including an endowment fund equal to 10% of the cost of the Arts Center to maintain this facility, the total estimated cost for the Arts Center is \$11.6 million.

WHAT PERCENTAGE OF FUNDS NEEDS TO BE RAISED BEFORE CONSTRUCTION CAN BEGIN?

An additional \$800,000 in cash and \$5,800,000 in pledges.

HOW SOON CAN THE OTHER MASTER PLAN PROJECTS BE REALIZED?

It is possible that other Master Plan projects can be completed within 2 - 4 years if additional funds are raised through the Arts Center campaign.

IS THERE A TAX BENEFIT FOR THE DONORS?

Yes. For most, if not all donors, this will be the case.

WHAT OTHER PROJECTS ARE IN THE MASTER PLAN AND WHAT ARE THE ESTIMATED COSTS?

Included in the Master Plan are as follows:

- New 200+ Seat Chapel \$2.5 million
- New Main Entry/Admin Office Area (+ 5 Classrooms) - \$3.5 million
- Widen Crittenden Avenue (additional parking) - \$1 million
- Campus Expansion Improvements including new activity field, parking, vehicular access control - \$1 million
- New 2-story Stadium Building for Locker Room, Wrestling, Expanded Weight Room - \$3 million
- Storage/Maintenance Building \$550,000
- Expanded Main Gym Lobby (Crittenden Avenue) - \$800,000

Note: Endowments -- Each Project Includes a 10% Factor for Endowments

WHAT IS THE TIMELINE?

We are still determining that based on the results of this feasibility study. The hope is to break ground during the summer of 2024. We would look to complete work by the beginning of the 2025-2026 school year.

WILL THIS PROJECT DISRUPT CAMPUS LIFE?

During construction, the disruption to campus life should be minimal, and there is a plan in place for replacing lost parking during construction.

HOW WILL TUITION BE AFFECTED?

The cost of the Arts Center includes an endowment that is earmarked for ongoing maintenance and capital improvements for the new facility. The endowment helps ensure that the Arts Center will not impact tuition in the future.

WILL THERE BE ADDITIONAL PARKING?

The plan provides for replacement of the parking spaces currently located on the Arts Center. By strategically removing the existing blockhouse building and burying power lines, we will essentially replace all the lost parking. There is also a plan in the future for additional parking on Evanston and Crittenden Avenues.

HOW WILL THIS IMPACT THE STUDENT BODY?

As seen in student testimonials included in this Position/Case Statement and through our initial feasibility research, our community believes that the Arts Center will provide students with the quality of space required to stage high-end productions in the arts and a wide variety of student activities that our current facilities do not adequately support.

WHO IS LEADING AND MANAGING THIS FEASIBILITY STUDY AND POSSIBLE FUTURE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN PROJECT?

Three groups are leading this process to determine the level of support Bishop Chatard High School can expect: 1. The BCHS Executive Committee led by school administrators, advancement personnel, and board members; 2. The Steering Committee that includes parents, alumni, past parents, community leaders, friends of BCHS, and faculty/staff; 3. The Institute for School and Parish Development (ISPD), a national Catholic development consulting firm.

HY SHOULD ALUMNI BE INVOLVED?

Alumni know that Bishop Chatard is a special place where they learned together, grew up, and shared traditions as they developed into young women and men who were well-prepared to take on the challenges of the world. Because of this spirit and bond, alumni will always belong to Bishop Chatard High School. When you belong, you care, you give sacrificially, and you stay involved for the sake of your shared experiences and for future generations to have these growth-filled and life-transforming experiences.
