2 SM 7:1-5, 8B-12, 14A, 16; PS 89:2-3, 4-5, 27, 29; LK 1:67-79

The tender compassion of our God, will break upon us and guide our feet into the way of Peace!

Ah, Peace! That's it! That's what I want in my heart this Christmas!

In a year none of us will soon forget, but all will be glad to move beyond, that Peace has sometimes alluded me.
