


Third Week of Advent Friday, December 18th, 2020

Many times throughout our life, we can lose trust in ourselves and become lost. In the readings today, the main focus is courage. In the first reading, God speaks of the days when all of his children will "dwell in security". He gives a new light for the Israelites in fear that they might not see freedom ever in their lives. In the Gospel, Matthew explains the events leading up to Jesus's birth. Even though Joseph thought his betrothed Mary had a son without him, he stuck with her. God came to him and told him "do not be afraid". Joseph puts his whole trust in God that he will be the father of Jesus.
