



Bishop Chatard High school is a Roman Catholic, archdiocesan secondary school with a primary focus on a college preparatory course of studies. The school is accredited by AdvancED and the state of Indiana. Located in the suburban northeast quarter of the city of Indianapolis, the school serves students from nine surrounding parish elementary schools and other central Indiana schools. Enrollment for the current year is 714, of which, 19% are minority students. The school operates on a traditional schedule with most students taking 7 subjects as their course of study. The school has an extensive Advanced Placement and honors program as well as general level courses and a wide-ranging academic support program. Bishop Chatard is committed to the education of the whole person, and while emphasis is placed on academics, students deepen their faith through retreats, liturgical celebrations, and service projects, and develop their talents and interests through a broad spectrum of extracurricular activities.

CHRISTIAN SERVICE PROGRAM

Each student is asked to fulfill the minimum service hour requirements, as well as tracking and submitting the number of service hours completed. All students participate in Community Service Day. Freshmen complete 15 hours of service and write a reflective essay. Sophomores complete 15 hours of service, 3 hours of which must be outreach. Juniors complete 15 hours of service, 6 hours of which must be outreach. Seniors complete 15 hours, 10 hours of which must be outreach and write a reflective essay.

Failure to complete requirements will not impact the GPA but will result in an incomplete on the permanent record of the student - both report card and cumulative final transcript.

THE SUMMA CUM LAUDE DISTINCTION

Summa Cum Laude represents the highest distinction a Bishop Chatard graduate can receive. The Summa distinction program requires students to commit to an intensive course of study at the highest academic level offered by the school; to achieve the highest standards of academic success as demonstrated by school exams and standardized testing; to participate and be a leader in the school and community; to engage in the Christian Service Program beyond the minimum requirements; and to attain and sustain a 4.0 G.P.A. The successful Summa candidate will prepare and defend the Summa senior thesis, approved by the Summa Cum Laude advisory board.
