We are fast approaching our Early Action November 1st deadline, and applications are pouring out! Remember, November 1st is the deadline for most schools' applications in order to be considered for scholarships.

To-Do Lists

Last week, during FLEX, seniors were given an hour to work through their application process. Below is the step-by-step list they were given, along with resources linked to help them complete each step of the process.

Please work through these steps:

Senior FLEX Intro Video

- 1. Connect Common App to Scoir- This is how to communicate where to send transcripts
- 2. Request your Letter of Rec- MUST be requested through Scoir to send to schools
- 3. If you have NOT already, <u>schedule a meeting with Ms Burkett-</u> Get questions answered before fall break
- 4. <u>Log in or create Common App</u> This is your college application. Please use this time to work through your application.

5. If you have sent in your applications already, use this time to set up and take a look through your application portals for each school. This is where you will track your application, get your admission decision, and, for many schools, apply for more scholarships and honors colleges.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Document Matching:

- It will take two solid weeks for your application to match to your transcript on the college's end and your application portal
- This could take longer the closer you get to the Nov 1st deadline
- Submitting early will expedite this process
- The guaranteed deadline for Early Action transcripts to be sent to schools is 11:59 pm on
 October 31st. After this point, I cannot guarantee they will be sent before the Nov 1st deadline,
 so submit well before Halloween to be sure.


STARS: Some schools require what is called a "Self reported Transcript and academic record" or STARS. No Indiana schools require this, but if you are applying to others, such as the University of Tennessee, check the application requirements to see if this is something you have to do. This is outside of the Common App. Your school application portal will have your information for this step.

Ball State


Lindsey Speer from BSU will be at Chatard on Wednesday, October 1st at 7:45 am to present to interested students in room 205.

If you are applying to Ball State, you might have a FREE application sitting in your email. Search "Ball State Select Nominee" in your email. This is a fee waiver sent out directly to students who qualify that allows you to apply to BSU for free! You can then select this in the Common App (see screenshot below):

<u>IU GROUPS</u>

IU Groups Scholars Program puts first-generation students and those with socioeconomic barriers on the path to college success by providing academic, financial, and social support, helping them attain a bachelor's degree at Indiana University. In addition, students are offered an extensive student support system, including academic advising, tutoring, enrollment in specialized courses, and activities designed to foster academic success and degree completion.

In order to be nominated for this opportunity, students must have a 2.5 gpa and meet the below financial requirements. <u>All interested students must fill out this application to be nominated.</u> <u>ALL</u> students who qualify and fill out the link will be nominated and complete the application on IU's portal.

Students' families must meet the income guidelines here:

Size of Family	Family's Annual Income MUST be Below
Unit 1	\$35,000
2	\$45,000
3	\$55,000
4	\$65,000
5	\$75,000
6	\$85,000
7	\$95,000
8	\$105,000
Greater than 8	Add \$10,000 for each additional member

FINANCIAL AID

The FAFSA is now open!

The FAFSA is the starting point for ALL financial aid and most schools require it even for merit-based aid. It gives institutions a complete picture of your family's financial situation and *ideally* helps them see your funding gaps, whether you qualify for a Pell Grant or not.

- Both students and parents will need to file a 2026-27 FAFSA on studentaid.gov
- Filing deadline is April 15 2026
- <u>Purdue scholarships</u> with <u>need-based consideration</u> have a FAFSA deadline of Dec 15th.

New to the 2026-2027 FAFSA Form:

Simplified Contributor Invites

Students are now able to invite a contributor to the FAFSA form by entering in the contributor's email. Once a student invites a contributor, the contributor will receive an email with a clickable link to file their portion of the FAFSA. The student will also get a copy of the invite in their email and a code the contributor can use to connect their account as the contributor for the student's FAFSA.

<u>Net Price Calculator</u>: If you are wondering how much a university is going to cost you, you
can fill out a net price calculator for your schools. There is a different calculator for each
school. For example, <u>here is IU's net price calculator</u>.

• <u>CSS Profile</u>- Some schools require families or give them the option to file the <u>CSS Profile</u>. This is a tool some schools use to find a more comprehensive fin aid picture. Notre Dame is the only Indiana school, but many out-of-state schools do so; always check the school website.

SCHOLARSHIP CORNER


