Dear Parents and Guardians of the Class of 2020,

Your child's senior year is in full swing! The first major senior event is coming soon. The *Living Rosary* will take place on Wednesday, October 2. Senior participation in this event is a long-standing tradition. This will be our 55th annual *Living Rosary*.

Please consider this a "save the date" notification. You are invited to join us for this event. We will have reserved seating in the middle portion of our bleachers for our guests. Please plan to arrive between 8:15 and 8:45 a.m. The *Living Rosary* will begin at 9:00 a.m. and last approximately 45 minutes. Bring your own rosary or we will have some to distribute as well.

Seniors ***need to arrive at school no later than 7:45 a.m. and report directly to the auxiliary gym.*** There will be a brief reception in the cafeteria for the seniors and their parents following the ceremony. ***The seniors are then released for the day following the reception.***

Please help us by having your student meet the dress code for this ceremony:

Gentlemen: Solid white shirt, tie, dark sport coat or suit jacket, dark dress pants with a belt, dark colored socks, and dress shoes. We ask that they be well-groomed and clean-shaven.

Ladies: A dark solid dress (may have some white accent, but no print) with sleeves or wide straps (no strapless, spaghetti straps, plunging necklines or backless dresses unless a dark sweater is worn as well). Dresses should not have large slits or uneven hemlines, and should not be too tight or form fitting. The hem of the dress must extend to the top of the kneecap.

OR: A white loose-fitting opaque (not transparent) or a dark top/blouse with dark slacks (no capri or tight-fitting pants) or dark solid skirt – again, not too tight or form-fitting, with a hem that extends to the top of the kneecap.

No large dangling earrings. Dress shoes are required. **Shoes should be dark or neutral, flats or low-heeled** (this is a safety issue). Open-toed shoes are acceptable, but no flip-flops, please.

We hope you will join us for this beautiful ceremony. Enjoy this year – it will go quickly!
